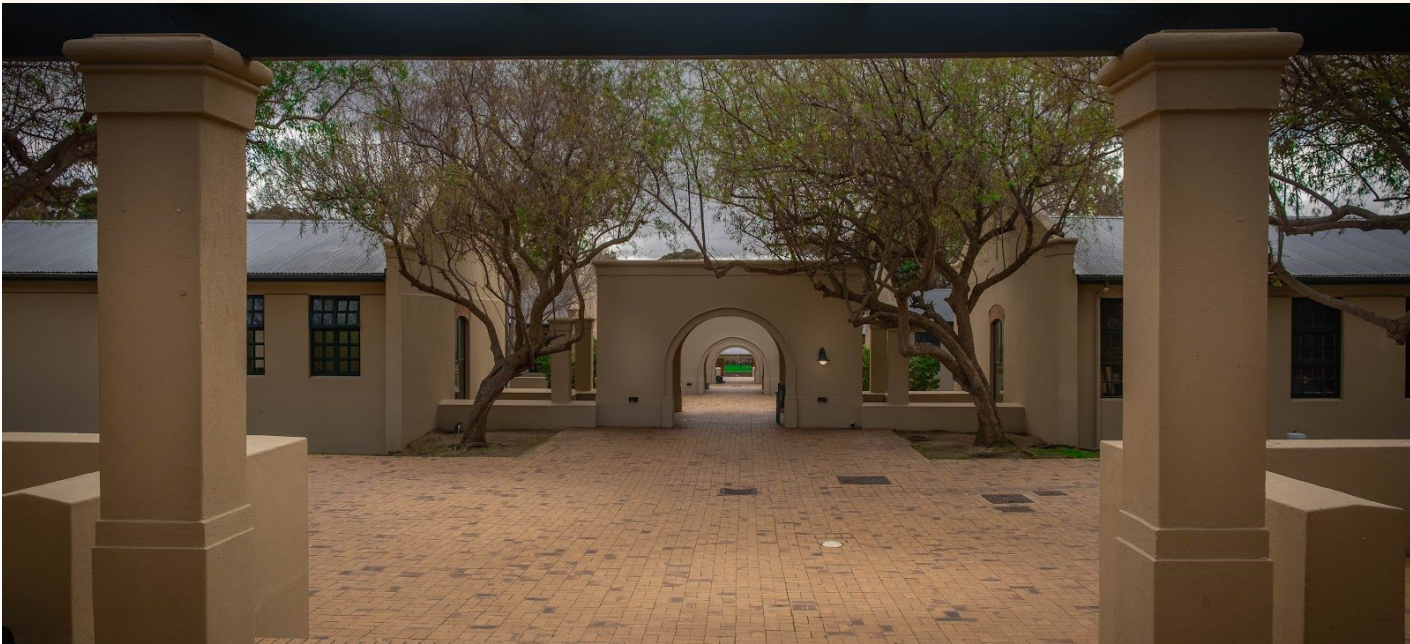


Reddam House Constantia

EDITOR'S VERDICT

Set against the Constantia winelands, Reddam House Constantia trades on place as much as programme: a Cape Town day school founded in 1997, non-religious, co-educational and English-medium, serving ages 5 to 18. The educational proposition is sharper than the branding. This is not a single-track school. It offers both the South African IEB route and Cambridge qualifications, including IGCSE and A Level, which gives families a real choice between a strong local university-prep pathway and a more international senior option. That dual structure is the point of interest here. Parents who want academic seriousness without locking a child into one examination system from the start will put it on a shortlist. The published ****100 percent matric pass rate**** strengthens that case, even if the school does not publish

the deeper outcome data that serious comparison also needs, such as subject distributions, bachelor pass rates or university destination breakdowns.

As part of the Inspired group, Reddam House Constantia sits in the *premium chain-school* segment, with all the advantages and limitations that brings. The advantages are obvious: scale, confidence, polished operations and a broad co-curricular expectation that reaches beyond exam preparation into sport and the creative arts. The limitation is just as clear: the group language is full of generic claims about excellence, vibrancy and contemporary education, and parents need more than that. What matters is that this campus covers the full school journey from primary through to senior years, remains a day school rather than a boarding proposition, and caters to a family looking for a *high-pressure but flexible* academic environment rather than a narrowly traditional one. It is a strong fit for able, busy students who want options open at 16 and 18, and who will use a school’s sporting and arts offer rather than treat it as decorative.

The child who thrives here is ambitious, organised and comfortable in a school that expects visible engagement. A student who wants only a quiet, stripped-back academic life has better fits elsewhere. Reddam House Constantia suits children who can handle a *full-programme school*—less monastic than an old-line academic institution, less loose than a progressive alternative, and more internationally minded than many local schools without abandoning South African academic credibility. For Cape Town families who want that balance, plus the practical convenience of a day-school model for ages **5-18**, this is a *serious contender*.

STRENGTHS

- Achieved a 100% IEB pass rate in 2025, with 303 subject distinctions and 31 students achieving A-aggregates, indicating consistently strong exam outcomes.
- One of the top-performing IEB schools in the country, it consistently has the best results of the Western Cape's three Reddam House schools.
- Part of the Inspired Education Group, giving students access to a worldwide network of affiliated schools and, per the group, College students are guaranteed entry to any of our premium boarding schools across the world should families relocate.
- The Constantia campus covers 32 acres with dedicated art, drama, dance, and music studios; computer and science laboratories; a spacious assembly hall; and expansive sports fields.
- Early Learning uses a Reggio Emilia-inspired approach, and from Grade 1 through Grade 12 students follow the IEB curriculum, allowing one continuous school journey from toddlerhood to matric.

TRADE - OFFS

- Fees are substantial: College fees range from ZAR 189,170 (Grade 8) to ZAR 194,840 (Grades 9-12) for 2026, placing it among Cape Town's pricier day schools.
- No dedicated SENCO, but school says it supports plenty of children with dyslexia, ADHD and other mild learning differences, meaning families needing specialist in-house support should verify provision directly.
- No specific English as an additional language (EAL) support, due to limited demand, we are told, which may matter to relocating expat families whose children are not yet fluent in English.
- Reddam House Constantia is a day school only, so families wanting on-site boarding must look elsewhere or transfer within the wider group network.

ADMISSIONS

Entry points run from Early Learning (from age one) through Grade 1 and Grade 8, with places also available on a case-by-case basis in other grades subject to availability. Applications are made via the school's admissions office, typically involving a form, school reports and an assessment or interview for older applicants. Given the school's strong IEB results and its position among Cape Town's established southern-suburbs day schools, demand for popular entry grades (Grade 1 and Grade 8) is competitive, and early application is advisable, particularly for relocating families needing mid-year placement.
