EDITOR'S VERDICT

Sekolah Bogor Raya sits in a useful gap in the Bogor market: a non-profit day school for ages 3 to 18 that runs the full IB continuum while also carrying Cambridge IGCSE, with English and Indonesian as languages of instruction. That combination matters. It gives families an international framework without forcing a Jakarta commute, and it gives students a route that keeps academic options open through secondary school. The school also carries two accreditations that parents should take seriously — IB World School and CIS — which place it above the loose “international” label that many schools in Indonesia still trade on. At an average annual day fee of ****100,314,526 IDR****, it sits in the ***serious but not absurd*** bracket for a full-range international school.

What sets it apart is breadth with a local footing. Sekolah Bogor Raya is not a foreign enclave dropped into West Java; it was established to educate both expatriate and Indonesian children, and that mixed brief remains one of its strengths. The editorial tagline's reference to worship across five faiths points to a school built for pluralism rather than a single confessional identity, which is unusual in a market where religious framing often dominates. Parents who want an English-medium education in a *genuinely mixed* community, but do not want a school stripped of Indonesian context, will find that balance attractive. The day-only model also tells you something important: this is a family school, not a boarding brand chasing prestige.

The caveat is straightforward. The school does not publish the hard outcome data that would sharpen the academic picture: no aggregate IB Diploma results, no IGCSE summary, no university destinations in the public domain. That makes Sekolah Bogor Raya easier to admire in structure than to judge in results. Parents who buy schools on published score tables will want more evidence. Parents who care more about continuity, bilingual fluency, and an *orderly, broad-gauge* international education in Bogor will keep it on the shortlist. The best fit is the student who is adaptable, comfortable across languages and cultures, and better served by a *balanced, community-rooted* school than by a narrow exam factory. For that child, the all-through span from age **3-18** and the dual English-Indonesian environment are real advantages.

STRENGTHS

- Offers the International Baccalaureate framework, giving students an internationally recognised curriculum pathway rather than a purely national one.
- Based in Bogor, a cooler hill-station city south of Jakarta, sparing families the capital's traffic congestion and denser pollution.
- Operates as a day school, which typically keeps fee structures lower than boarding alternatives available elsewhere in Indonesia.
- Smaller overall school community than the large flagship international schools in Jakarta, which can mean more direct staff-student contact.

TRADE-OFFS

- Location in Bogor makes it impractical for families based in central or north Jakarta who would face a lengthy daily commute.
- Editorial ranking places it as a lower-profile candidate-tier school, with limited publicly documented IB Diploma results or university placement data.
- Track record and long-term outcomes are harder to verify compared with longer-established IB schools in the region.
- Extracurricular, sports and facility breadth appears more modest than at larger international campuses in Jakarta or Bali.

ADMISSIONS

Admission is generally open at the start of each academic year, with some flexibility for mid-year entry depending on space. Prospective families should expect an application form, prior school records, and an assessment or interview, with English proficiency likely required given the IB instructional language. Competitiveness appears moderate rather than highly selective, consistent with its candidate-tier status. Families should confirm current IB programme authorisation (PYP/MYP/DP) and fee schedules directly with the school, as detailed public data on outcomes and selectivity is limited.
